#### **Zearn Checkpoint**

Now is the time to set expectations and check data for <u>Zearn Implementation</u> in the classroom. Reflect on the key factors of planning, behavior management, engagement, and goal setting through the use of the class reports.

Consider the following:

- Are teachers and students signing in to Zearn regularly?
- Are students getting 90 minutes per week with Zearn?
- Are students completing three grade-level Zearn lessons per week?

Reflecting on this data supports teacher success with the <u>high-impact tool</u>, Zearn.

#### **Updates with inquiryHub Biology**

The developers of <u>inquiryHub Biology</u> (<u>iHub</u>), one of Louisiana's identified <u>high-quality pilots in science</u>, have partnered with OpenSciEd to build on their previous work and develop new instructional resources for biology, chemistry, and physics. Full courses will be published on a rolling basis on the <u>OpenSciEd's website</u>. The current iHub materials and <u>Louisiana Guide to Piloting iHub Biology</u> will remain available; however, all curricular updates and professional learning will shift to the OpenSciEd versions of the materials.

## **EDUCATOR DEVELOPMENT**

#### **Evaluation Updates**

The deadline for systems to enter or upload 2022-2023 teacher, counselor, and librarian evaluation data into the Compass Information System (CIS) will follow VAM release in October. Teachers should meet with evaluators to review 2022-2023 observations and Student Learning Targets (SLT scores).

The <u>2023-2024 Evaluation Guide for Teachers</u> is available in the <u>Compass Library</u>. This document outlines all evaluation components to prepare teachers for the evaluation process.

Teachers should begin setting <u>Student Learning Targets (SLTs)</u> for the 2023-2024 school year and resources for <u>goal setting</u> are available in the Compass Library. **Evaluators and evaluatees must meet to discuss all SLTs.** SLTs may be entered into CIS once the system opens for the new year.

Per Bulletin 130, all educators will require two observations for the 2023-2024 school year.

All Louisiana pre-K-12 public school teachers are eligible to apply for a Quality Science and Math Grant of up to \$2,000 for the purchase of non-consumable materials and equipment to be used in science, math, and STEM courses. ## **EDUCATOR RECOGNITION**

#### **Seeking Nominations for Excellent Educators**

The LDOE recognizes that great teachers and school leaders are critical to student success. Annually, the LDOE honors some of the state's most successful educators through the Louisiana Teacher and Principal of the Year programs, as well as the Early Childhood Teacher and Leader of the Year programs, and the New Teacher of the Year program. (Candidates for the New Teacher of the Year program must have less than one year of teaching experience.)

Part of the selection process for naming the school system and state-level winners includes recommendations from teachers, principals, school system employees, parents, colleagues, and community members. To assist with the process, a <u>nominations portal</u> was created. This portal is now open and will close on **September 22**. Multiple nominations are accepted, as well as self-nominations. Upon closing of the portal, the nomination information will be shared with school systems for their consideration.

Stakeholders are encouraged to submit their nominations through the <u>nominations portal</u> to recognize outstanding teachers and leaders.
