### Fellowship Goal

The Department's goal is to provide high quality professional development in instructional leadership for both aspiring and veteran administrators.

Principals are the leaders of instructional change in schools.

### Principals:

- Set goals and the direction for the school with a focus on academic improvement,
- •Implement structures and processes for improvement, and
- Evaluate and provide feedback to all teachers.

## Foundation for Fellowship Program

The <u>Louisiana Principal Fellowship Program</u> is a sixteen month cohort training bringing together current and aspiring school leaders from across the state, who seek to build the skills to excel in instructional leadership.

The <u>Louisiana Principals' Teaching & Learning Guidebook</u> is accessed throughout sessions to ensure participants are able to connect each topic to the work of school leaders in Louisiana.

## Fellowship Program Framework

The Louisiana Principal Fellowship experience will build upon current and aspiring principals' administrative skills and experience, providing a framework for organizing the many facets of their role and providing a "call to action" to continually drive achievement higher.

### The Executive Development Program:

- deepens their knowledge,
- skills and confidence as strategic thinkers,
- and instructional leaders.

### Louisiana Principal Fellowship Program

The Principal Fellowship is designed with a cohort support structure that allows each participant to be a part of a cohesive learning team and community. Because of this fact, it is important that participants commit to attend and participate fully. Participant Expectations:

- Attend all sessions (attend make up sessions for missed days)
- •Complete all pre-work and be prepared to fully engage in sessions
- •Create and maintain a portfolio of assignments and experiences
- Collaborate with your peers to identify and address problems of practice
- •Build and maintain a relationship with your assigned mentor
- Abide by established cohort norms

### Certified Facilitator Program

In addition to the expectations of the Principal Fellowship participants, Facilitator responsibilities include:

- •Facilitate the Louisiana Principal Fellowship Program to develop the executive leadership skills of school and district leaders, school leadership teams, instructional coaches, and other key stakeholders
- •Deliver high quality, responsive and collaborative professional development to help participants meet their goals
- •Incorporate adult learning strategies and multiple learning styles in an effective learning environment
- •Participate in learning experiences with colleagues to maintain expertise related to your professional practice

<sup>\*</sup>Some selected leaders will join at possible future facilitators. These leaders go through the full Executive Development Program, plus two intensive days of facilitation training.

### **Training Options**

Participants will complete one of the following training options:

<u>Louisiana Principal Fellowship Program</u> – Train School Leaders

<u>Certified Facilitator Program</u> – Train-the-Trainer

Most often the target audience includes principals or aspiring leaders, but may also include teacher-leaders, other members of school leadership teams or district staff.
