

Mentor Training and Assessment Guidance

In October 2018, BESE approved regulations to establish <u>Mentors and Content Leader credentials</u> in the form of an ancillary certificate. Starting September 1, 2020, the Mentor ancillary or provisional certificate is required for individuals who serve as a mentor of undergraduate or post-baccalaureate teacher residents.

At the June 2020 BESE meeting, the Board *adopted a policy that reduces the number of Elementary assessments from six to four.* This policy change is expected to go into effect in Fall 2020. The recommendations BESE received in June include:

- Departmentalized Elementary teachers take the two content assessments in their area of specialization
- Elementary teachers who teach both ELA and Mathematics take one assessment in each content area

Teachers should choose the training and assessment pathways that most closely align with their teaching placement.
