

1. What is the purpose of the School Choice Program for Certain Student with Exceptionalities?

The School Choice Program for Certain Students with Exceptionalities (SCP) empowers families of students with exceptionalities with the opportunity to select a school that the family feels will best address the student’s needs.

FOR FAMILIES:

2. What students are eligible to participate in this program?

Students participating in the SCP must meet all of the following eligibility requirements:

- a) Student has been evaluated by a **Louisiana public school** and determined to have any one of the following exceptionalities:
 - Autism
 - Developmental Delay
 - Emotional Disturbance
 - Mental Disability
 - Other Health Impairment
 - Specific Learning Disability
 - Traumatic Brain Injury
- b) The student has an Individual Education Plan, district provided services plan or a nonpublic school created service plan; and,
- c) The student is eligible to attend a Louisiana public school.

3. Which schools currently participate in this program?

5. How much financial assistance is provided through this program?

Families participating in this program receive an educational certificate, which is paid directly to the school on behalf of the family. The certificate is worth either approximately 50% of the per-pupil allocation of state funds to the student’s local school district, or the school’s tuition and fees, whichever is less. This amount averages to approximately \$2500 across the state. If the school’s tuition and fees exceeds the certificate amount, then parents are responsible for paying the difference.

6. How does a student apply for participation in the program?

Families wishing for their student to participate in this program must complete the student application and turn the application into a participating school for which they are applying by March 17th. Once all applications are received,

the Department will conduct a lottery to determine which students may participate in the program. Scholarships are awarded contingent upon funding availability.

Application Dates:

- February 1st, 2017 – LDE releases student application
- March 17th, 2017 – Applications due
- April 2017 – LDE notifies families of application status

Instructions on how to submit an application may be found on the application itself. New students must submit all required documentation in order to confirm eligibility.

7. Does the school automatically enroll my student if selected to participate in this program?

Not necessarily. Each participating school still has discretion in maintaining their own admissions criteria and may decide whether or not to admit and enroll the student.

FOR SCHOOLS:

8. What are the eligibility requirements for schools to participate participation?

Schools wishing to participate in the School Choice program must meet all of the following eligibility requirements:

- a) Be approved by the Board of Elementary and Secondary Education
- b) Comply with the racial non-discrimination criteria set forth in *Brumfield, et al. v. Dodd*
- c) Operate in a parish with a recent census population greater than 190,000 persons:
 - Caddo
 - Calcasieu
 - East Baton Rouge
 - Jefferson
 - Lafayette
 - Orleans
 - St. Tammany
- d) Has provided educational services to students with exceptionalities for at least two years prior to participation
- e) Have teachers that hold appropriate certification in special education

9. How does my school sign up to participate in this program?

To participate, schools must complete and submit a Notice of Intent to participate form to the Louisiana Department of Education (LDE). The notice of intent form must include:

- Evidence of the school providing special education services for at least the past two years (Individual Education Plan, district provided services plan or a nonpublic school created service plan must be provided)
- Documentation that the school has teachers certified in special education.

10. How does the Department of Education determine which students may participate in the program?

The LDE will conduct a random lottery to determine which students may participate in the program. Continuing students receive first preference. The number of new participants depends on the number of new students that applied, number of available seats indicated by schools, and funding available for the program.

11. What information should my school include in a nonpublic school created special education plan?

The following information should be included in the nonpublic school created special education plan:

1) the student's exceptionality; 2) the services provided by the school; 3) specificity of how those services address the student's exceptionality and needs; 4) indication that the plan will be active for the 2017-18 school year; and 5) parental consent of the plan (via signature).

12. Do schools maintain their admissions criteria?

Yes, participating schools maintain their own admissions criteria. Participating students must still be admitted and enrolled in the school to use the educational certificate.

13. Does this certificate cover all expenses at the participating school?

Families are responsible for covering any additional tuition and fees not covered by the program certificate.

14. When will my school receive payment from the LDE for these students?

The LDE will make four equal payments to each participating school on behalf of the families in September, November, February, and May.

15. Do students participating in this program have to take the standardized state exams?

Students participating in this program do not have to take any standardized state exams.

16. Do participating students have to follow my school's discipline policies?

All students participating in this program are subject to their school's discipline policies and procedures.

17. Does this program require the school to submit any fiscal reports?

The only reports required for schools are enrollment verification reports before each quarterly payment. Other than that, no other fiscal reports or audits are required of each school.
