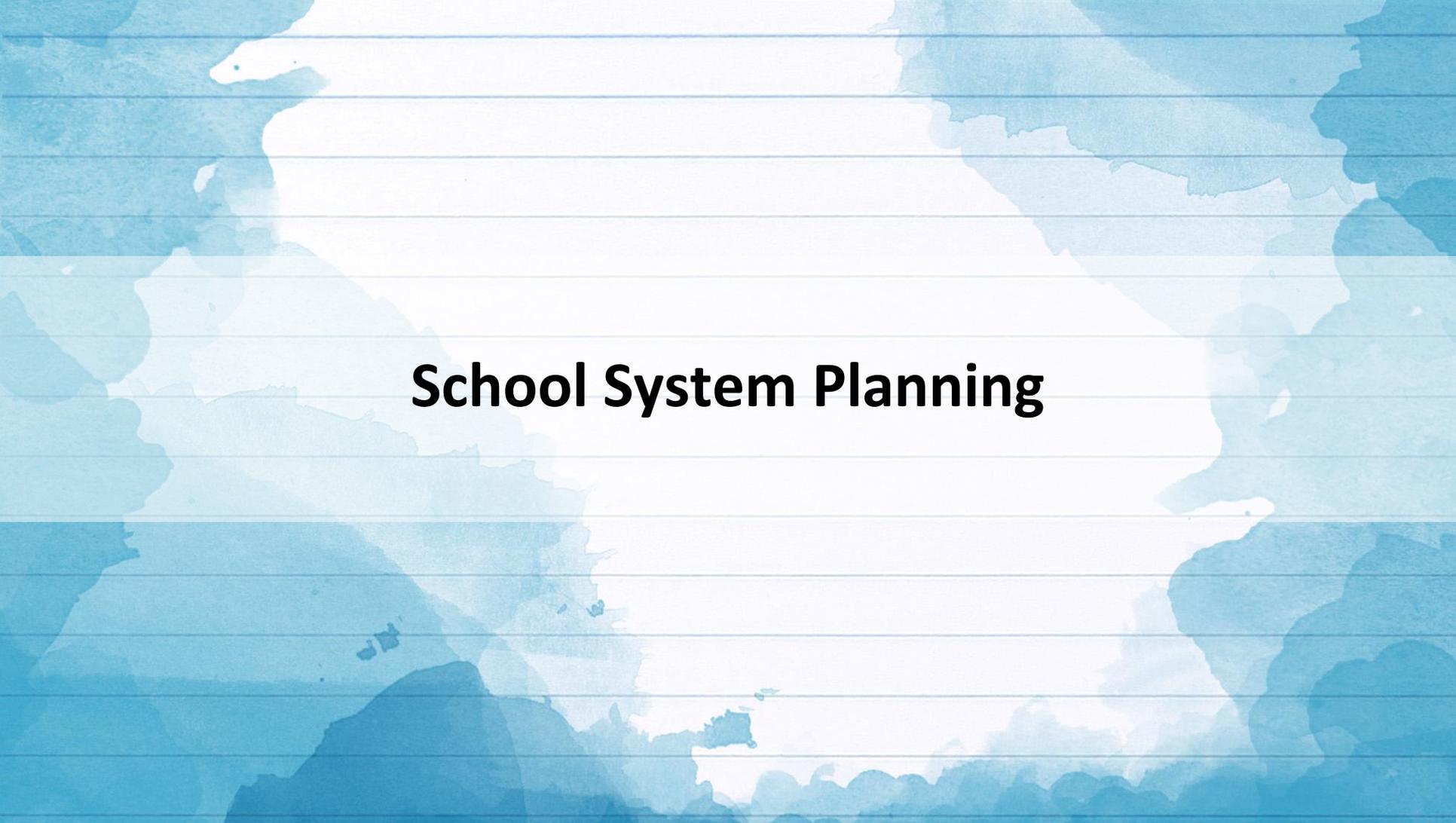

# Back-to-School Support: Updated Educator Resource Guide

The Department released updates to the [2019-2020 Educator Resource Guide](#) providing teachers, principals, and school system leaders with the tools they need the most to start the new school year and support 2019-2020 priorities.

Each page of the guide (teacher, principal, or school system leader) contains a list of:

- meetings and events;
- communication streams; and
- planning, instructional, goal-setting, assessment and family engagement resources.

**All Special Education Leaders should review page 4: “School System Resources and Support”.** A final update will be released on October 1.

# Back-to-School Support: Parent Involvement in School Improvement Plans

In the 2019 regular session, the Legislature [updated and clarified the requirements](#) for school systems relative to parent involvement in school improvement plans. School systems are required to take two actions:

1. Present the 2019-2020 approved school improvement plans to families within 60 days of the start of the school year. A draft presentation which school systems may adapt is [available](#). As required by law, the Department will report to the Legislature on each school's compliance by March 1. School systems must report their meeting dates to the Department using [this survey](#) by December 1.
2. Consult with parents when developing school improvement plans within the Super App for 2020-2021.

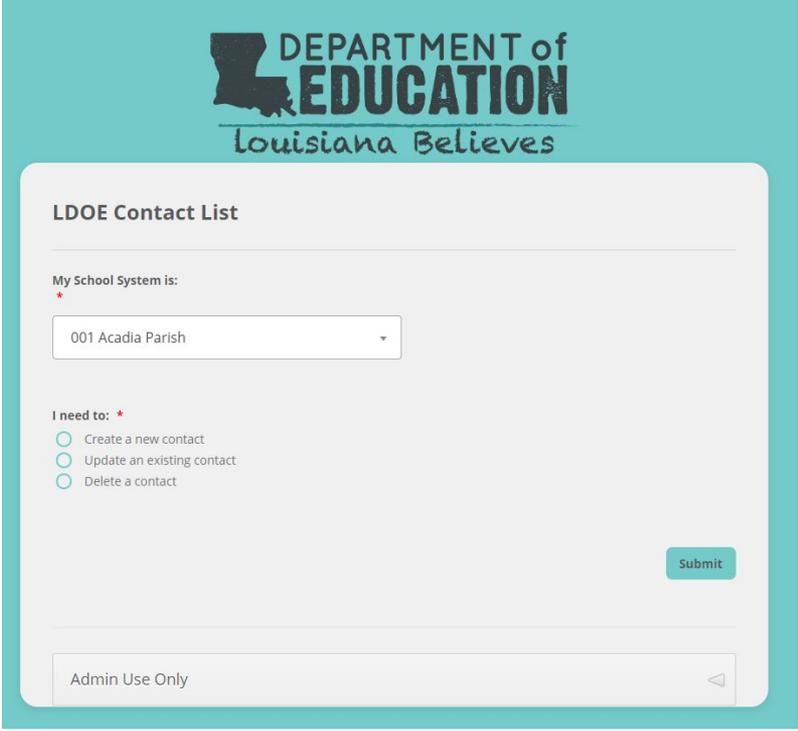
In order to streamline the process of collecting contact information from school system supervisors and ensure timely information is sent to school systems throughout the year, the **Department has created the [Louisiana School System Contact Form](#).**

**Personnel Directors will serve as the key point of contact for the form** within school systems, and will be responsible for entering and updating contacts.

Each school system should **submit NEW contact information for ALL school system supervisors by September 13.**

# 2020-2021 School System Planning: Super App Launch

In 2018-2019, the Department launched the first Super App and awarded \$40M in competitive funds to improve CIR and UIR schools. The Department will launch the 2020-2021 school system planning process and Super App at the Super App Launch in November.

# High Cost Service Update

The Department has established a High Cost Services grant to support school systems and schools who serve our students with the most challenging needs. This High Cost Services grant provides additional funding for high-cost special education services for students with disabilities. This grant is funded through the state's IDEA allocation and Minimum Foundation Program (MFP) formula. The Department would like to share the following updates:

- The 2019 - 2020 High Cost Service Round 1 application is scheduled to be released mid to late October. The [state plan](#) is now available.
- The IDEA portion of the LEAs 2018 - 2019 High Cost Services funding is set to expire on September 30, 2019. Funds must be obligated and/or expended by September 30, 2019.

# Alternate Assessment Review Process

The Every Student Succeeds Act (ESSA) requires states to ensure that only students with the most significant cognitive disabilities take the LEAP Connect alternate assessment. The Department conducted a review of student files to verify eligibility for alternate assessment participation for the 2018-2019 school year.

**Preliminary eligibility determination letters were sent by email to Special Education Directors/Supervisors on Tuesday, September 3, 2019. Any actions stated in these preliminary determinations must be completed on or before Thursday, September 5, 2019.**

If additional documentation requested is not provided on or before September 5, students found to be tentatively eligible/ineligible will be considered ineligible and tests voided for accountability.

# Bulletin 1530 Updates

BESE approved alternate assessment eligibility criteria revisions to Bulletin 1530, *Louisiana IEP Handbook for Students with Exceptionalities* in December 2018. These are effective for the 2019-2020 school year.

The Department has issued guidance documents reflecting the updated criteria:

In addition, SER updates for the 2019-2020 school year are now available. These policy revisions are reflected throughout the IEP.

Please note the version of Bulletin 1530 on BESE's website contains a technical error. This will be updated in the fall. Until then, use the guidance linked above and the IEP in SER, both reflect the BESE-approved policy changes.

# Special Education Reporting System (SER)

## October 1 IDEA Collection

**Oct 1:** The count for the Individuals with Disabilities Education Act (IDEA) collection is as of October 1. The collection of this data is used for funding and federal reporting.

**IDEA Count Deadline: October 31, 2019**

**IDEA SER Data Criteria:** Students with disabilities must have the following in SER to be included in the IDEA Child Count

- a current Evaluation,
- a current IEP,
- and receiving services as of October 1 to be included in the IDEA Child Count.

**IDEA Preliminary Run Date: (September 9, 2019)**

**IDEA Preliminary Reports: Reports to run and verify**

- IDEA - IDEA Counted, Not Counted, NEW FAPE Counted, Not Counted, and summary, FED Eval Listing Pub/Private and summary, SER/SIS, SER/SIS (Child Count Compare), SIS/SER Cross Checks
- Personnel Table - Personnel Table 2 Detail, Personnel Table 2 Summary, and IDEA Services Listings

# Special Education Reporting System (SER) Post School Transition Survey

All states must now include elements of competitive integrated employment into required post school transition (PST) surveys. In response, the Department is adding enhancements to the SER system to integrate the new federal definition of Competitive Integrated Employment into the Post-School Transition (PST) Survey. These enhancements include:

- PST Survey questions will appear on the Post-School Transition page, when Exit Year Follow-up is selected
- Each question will contain a dropdown box to select the answer offered by the student
- Work Type will populate based off of the answers from the PST Survey

Enhancements will be deployed in **late-September**.

# TS GOLD for OSEP

As a reminder, all children with disabilities age 3 through 5 currently receiving special education services must be assessed annually within TS GOLD™ OSEP license as required for federal reporting. Entry assessments must be finalized within 6 weeks of the start of 619B services.

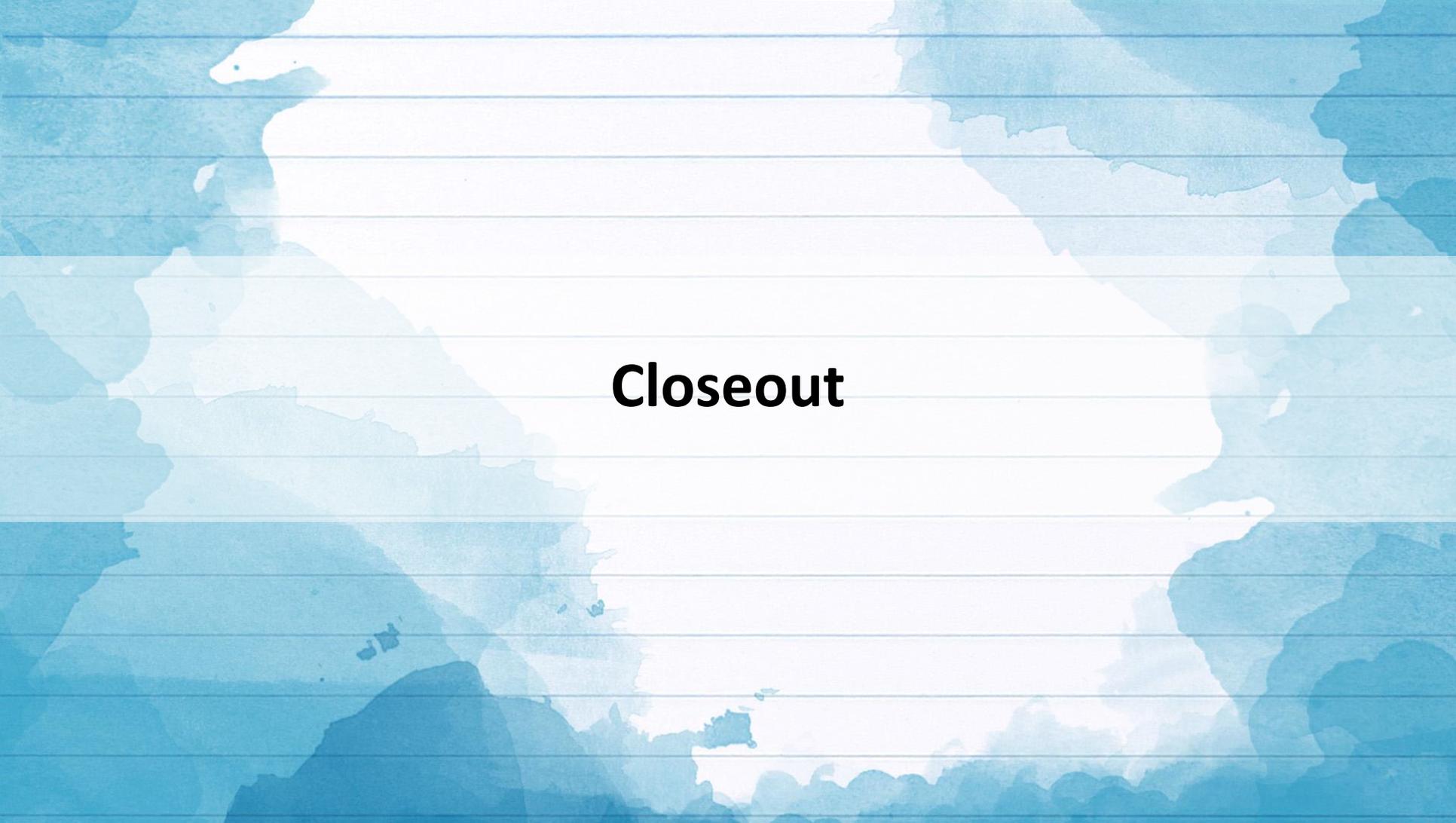
