Texts	<p>All units require classrooms to all the texts used in the unit. No texts listed are optional. There are two ways to determine the needed texts:</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. <u>Text Access Page</u>: Each unit has a Text Access page that identifies the needed texts and access links. Teachers should access this page to access texts for a single classroom. 2. <u>Text Purchase Worksheet</u>: Each unit also has a Text Purchase Worksheet.
