

No academic requirements for admission to the institution. Individual courses or programs may have academic requirements.






Minimum Admission Standards




- Students who complete their core coursework can pursue college admission at their institution of choice by earning an associate's degree or successfully completing the required number of early college academic credits with a qualifying GPA.
- Early college credit can be earned through dual enrollment, AP, IB, or CLEP; it is noted that securing credit hours for AP, IB, or CLEP is contingent on the student achieving the appropriate score.

Academic Affairs Policy 2.22

Dual Enrollment Minimum Eligibility Policy

A student is eligible to enroll in Academic Dual Enrollment Courses if they meet ANY of the					
following criteria ¹					
1. Success in high school					
2.5 cumulative high school GPA					
AND					
Subject-specific minimum scores on any assessment listed in Figure 1.		Counselor recommendation based on overall student performance and grade trends in the subject.			
2. Success in subject area					
3.0 cumulative <u>high school</u> subject-area GPA, as determined by the postsecondary institution.		Counselor recommendation based on grade trends in the subject.			
3. Success in previous dual enrollment courses ²					
2.5 cumulative college GPA, as demonstrated in prior dual enrollment participation.					
4. Meet the eligibility thresholds required by an approved Early College Academy.					

¹ Any of these three criteria qualify a student to continue to take dual enrollment classes. Criterion 3 should not be construed as exclusionary.

² Unlike criterion 1 and criterion 2, which are subject-area-based, criterion 3 creates eligibility in all subject areas.



Academic Affairs Policy 2.22

Dual Enrollment Minimum Eligibility Policy

Technical Dual Enrollment courses are predominantly taught at two-year institutions, which are open admission. These course requirements may differ by institution.³

A student is eligible to enroll in Technical Dual Enrollment Courses if they meet ANY of the following four criteria

1. Success in high school

2.0 cumulative high school GPA

2. Success in high school performance

Counselor's recommendation based on relevant high school performance.

- 3. Success in previous dual enrollment courses
 - 2.0 cumulative **college** GPA, as demonstrated in prior dual enrollment participation.
- 4. Meet the eligibility thresholds required by an approved Early College Academy.

³ In addition to the requirements listed in the table, some courses have additional safety requirements, and some programs have minimum age requirements set by regulatory agencies. Please reference the postsecondary institution of interest to ensure the student meets regulatory requirements and that any safety compliance prerequisites are met.


Dual Enrollment Task Force

- 13 members including: Educators, Non-profit Representatives, Advocates, Counselors, and more.











How much does it cost to take Dual Enrollment courses?

Dual enrollment classes generally cost between \$0 to \$400, which is significantly less than the cost of a traditional college class. Dual credit tuition costs may be covered by the state, the student's high school district, the student or their parent/guardian, or some combination of these. College course vary by course and campus. Students should consult with their high school counselor or college/university's Admissions Office for information about tuition and fees.


